BADMINTON, MIZORAM



Launch of badminton initiative and Training of Trainers (ToT) in Aizawl, Mizoram

Tata Trusts, in collaboration with NEIDA, Mizoram Badminton Association (MBA), Mizoram State Sports Council (MSSC) and Pullela Gopichand Badminton Academy (PGBA), have launched a badminton initiative in Mizoram to help develop a sustainable ecosystem for badminton in the state through infrastructure improvement, skill development and professional training. The initiative will look to engage 1600-2000 children between the ages of 6yrs to 15 yrs by end of 2020, and develop a 3-tier structure starting with Grassroots Centres in all 8 districts of Mizoram, moving on to Regional Development Centres (RDCs) in district headquarters and culminating in a High Altitude

Training Centre (HATC) which will act as an excellence centre. A Training of Trainers (ToT) course was conducted in Aizawl to kick-start the initiative on 12th and 13th of April 2018 in Aizawl.
